The session was opened by prayers led by the Presiding Officer. The Secretary called the roll. In view of the presence of guests, Honorable Benjamin Taasan moved that the reading of the minutes be dispensed. This was seconded by Honorable Leovigildo Diaz.

The Presiding Officer introduced Atty. Cipriano Cabaluna, Provincial Assessor to the body. The latter briefed the body on the advantages of a Tax Mapping Program to the municipality, the approximate cost, the financing schemes and its mechanics.

Honorable Benjamin Taasan inquired on the purposes of tax mapping which Atty. Cabaluna answered for updating tax declarations and to discover absolute portions or parcels in the municipality.

Honorable Jose Tuvida then moved that authority be given the Provincial Governor to negotiate for the financing scheme of a tax mapping program of the municipality, preferably with the PDAP. This was seconded by Honorable Benjamin Taasan.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNOR OF THE PROVINCE OF ILOILO TO NEGOTIATE WITH AGENCIES PREFERABLY THE PDAP TO FINANCE THE TAX MAPPING PROGRAM OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TIGBAUAN, ILOILO.

Presented and considered by the Sangguniang Bayan, Tigbauan, Iloilo is Ordinance No. 70, s. 1977 of this Municipality.

Resolved to enact as it is hereby enacted the following Ordinance to wit:

Ordinance No. 70, s. 1977

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4 (A), ZONE 4 (I) AND 5 (C), ZONE 6 OF FISHERY ORDINANCE NO. 1, s. 1976, ONLY APPROVED BY THE HONORABLE, THE SECRETARY OF NATURAL RESOURCES ON FEBRUARY 18, 1977.

WHEREAS, the present market value of fish is much higher than during the previous years;

WHEREAS, fishery zone 4 or Lim-aw is noted for quality species of fish which demands a high market price;

WHEREAS, inspite of the foregoing, the fishery income of the Municipality of Tigbauan, Iloilo, Philippines, during the previous fiscal year 1976-1977 has decreased by P46,280.00 due to the connivance of several bidders to peg their bids to the minimum annual rentals, for among others, Fishery zone 4 or Lim-aw and Fishery zone 6 or "Gutukan" or "Banguas" fry area;

NOW, THEREFORE, in order to discourage the repetition of the aforementioned anomalous practice of the bidders, Fishery Ordinance No. 1, s. 1976, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1 - Zone 4 or Lim-aw is amended by increasing the Minimum Annual Rental from P15,000.00 to P20,000.00 to read as follows:

Section 1 (A), Zone 4 -
1. Lim-aw - the combination of Bay and Binay sites
The preceding 6 meters deep, located in front of Bay-an Bridge,
372 meters from Barangay boundary monument No. 1.
Minimum Annual Rental P20,000.00"

Section 2 - Zone 6 or "Gutukan" or "Banguas" fry area is amended by increasing the minimum annual rental from P20,000.00 to P35,000.00 to read as follows:

Section 3 (C) -
Zone 6 - This is known as "Gutukan" or "Banguas" fry area. The shoreline from the mouth of Ole Barroc Creek at Barangay Barroc up to Nanga Creek which is located between the boundary of the municipalities of Tigbauan and Guishal. This sites is adjacent and parallel to zone 5 but is only five meters more or less from the shore going seaward and occupies the uppermost crests of the sea.

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
